FROM OUR SECRETARY Sad State of Affairs

When I was Junior Warden back in 1986, I had the responsibility for Perry Point Escort Service, which all Junior Wardens handled. At that time, Stephenson Lodge received a letter in December from Perry Point Veteran Hospital informing us of our dates to attend. Four times a year we would gather as a small group of five to ten brothers and travel to the McDonalds in Havre de Grace fro a quick breakfast before crossing the river.

Typically, once we arrived there we were greeted by Brother Pierce, who was the Chaplain, in his office. He would have a typewritten page with each building and the names of the patients wishing to attend that morning's service. He would tell us about each patient, a short history, what branch of service he or she came from and any issues we needed to be aware of. We would then break into smaller groups and head out to the different buildings, some being quite a distance away. We travel through long hallways and various buildings, and sometimes outside to get to the various buildings. There was always a brother that knew the way who would take the newbies along. At the nurses' station, the veterans would be in their wheelchairs, *continued on page 5*

dressed for the season, ready to go. Often there were three or four ready to travel to Church. We'd carry on a short conversation with them armed with the information provided by Brother Pierce. Once at the chapel, we lined the wheelchairs in front and took our seats as a group in the pews. After the service, we'd take our respective patients back to their room, where they would thank us for assisting them. We'd be back home before lunch, feeling like we had done a service to our veterans.

A few years ago things changed there for us. When we arrived, the office that had always been open for us to sign in and meet with the chaplain was locked. We waited around until the time was getting so close to the service that we traveled to the closest buildings to see if any veterans were ready and wanted to go. At each building, we heard the same response; no one was ready or prepared to go. The nurses asked a few patients, but you could tell, they were not ready and the time was too short. So we all returned back to the chapel. A few minutes prior to the service, we saw a young African American zoom into the parking lot. After getting out of his car, we watched him as he tied his necktie crossing the parking lot headed our way. You can imagine our surprise to find out he was the chaplain. The service started as soon as he unlocked the doors. We had brought no veterans with us, so we sat together for the quick service.

We returned for two or three more times, but each time it was the same, the office was locked and no one was ready. Brother Kermit Olinger, HPM contacted the office multiple times, each with the promise that the office would be ready, and we would have patients to escort. It never happened. Last year and this year, we haven't gotten a schedule from for Perry Point Veteran Hospital.



Brother Olinger finally gave up after repeatedly getting the red tape and empty promises.

I see in the recent Sun Paper that the Baltimore area Veteran Office is listed as the worst run one in the States. Veterans are waiting years, and some are dying without getting disability claims handled. We, as a nation claim to support and honor our veterans, but it seems that the Federal workforce that are hired to help them, fail in that task. Seeing what has happened at the Perry Point Veteran Hospital Escort Service has driven the point home. Although the brothers of Stephenson Lodge volunteered their Sunday mornings by providing a free method of getting veterans wanting to attend their chapel's service, the workers there can not even take the time to provide us with dates, or be there on time to give the names and buildings of those men and women who served their country. Right now, we don't provide the service and haven't for the past two years. Perhaps sometime in the future, we'll return to help out again.
