A CHRISTMAS STORY

Stephenson Lodge plays Santa for local six-year old

Stephenson Lodge is located in a large, rather old building that was purchased from the Harford County School System over 60 year ago. For decades, the Lodge rented half of the first floor to a doctor. A few years ago, ownership transferred to the Stephenson Holding Company. Our renter now is the *Twice Blessed Thrift Shop*, which is affiliated with the Darlington United Methodist Church. This shop offers discounted clothing and household goods to less fortunate people in the area. Due to the economy, the number of local families in need has grown, and the thrift shop has become overwhelmed by requests.

This past Christmas, at a monthly Holding Company meeting, a motion was made to give the thrift shop a month of free rent. The motion was quickly seconded and approved. Then, the Lodge voted to donate \$100 to the shop. Afterwards, members personally donated another \$360, bringing the total to approximately \$1,000, factoring in the free rent.

A day before the checks were presented to the *Twice* Blessed Thrift Shop, a family approached them, requesting clothing and aid. The mother of the family lives in the area and had developed cancer. When her son and his family came for a visit, they realized how sick she was. They returned to Florida and within a few weeks, they had managed to sell everything and moved to our area to care for the mother. To do that, they had to let go of all of their possessions. Once relocated, they found themselves without winter clothes and supplies. Their six-year-old son wasn't able to bring his toys with him. The family needed help, and the *Twice Blessed Thrift Shop* was there to help.

The shop needed more income to assist the family, and as provident would have it, Stephenson Holding Company and Stephenson Lodge provided it the next day. Members of the Lodge met with the family and worked with them to ensure that their son would have a good Christmas, receiving toys to replace the ones left behind. Spider Man action figures were one of his favorite toys. The members were able to locate some Spider Man items, along with trucks and cowboy play sets for him, along with wrapping paper, ribbons and bows to complete the gifts. The items were dropped off to the Twice Blessed Thrift Shop a

few days before Christmas. The shop sent a thank you card to the members of the Lodge and Holding Company, thanking them for the donations and for all that the Masonic organization has done for them over the years.

After Christmas, the Lodge received a handwritten note from the family, thanking them for the gifts for their son. They said that their son sleeps with his new toys, fearing

that someone might take them. Also enclosed in the note were a series of snapshots of their son opening the donated gifts. The son also wrote a short note thanking the Masons for telling Santa Claus that he had moved from Florida to Maryland so he could find him.

There are three tenets to being a Mason — Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. The members of Stephenson
