## **New Edict on Rights of Visitation from Grand Master Piepiora**

#### RIGHTS OF VISITATION

There has been considerable debate regarding the rights of members and current dues cards for at least as long as I have been a member (and probably much longer).

Full right of membership is afforded to members carrying a current year's dues card.

These include:

- 1. Rights of visitation to home and other Lodges in Maryland
- Ability to become a plural member of other Lodges in Maryland and dual membership of Lodges out of State (where allowed).
- 3. Entrance into Maryland Masonic Homes (providing medical and financial requirements are met).
- 4. Being able to belong to other appendant Bodies.
- Holding appointed and elected offices within Lodges and the Grand Lodge.
- 6. Eligible for Grand Lodge Service awards.
- 7. Transfer of membership to other Lodges within/without our jurisdiction.
- 8. Receiving a Masonic Memorial/Burial service.

Without-question, the above list is not all inclusive, but indicates there are many rights and privileges. We also understand that those who do not keep up with their dues lose some, if not, all of their rights. (These are all found in the Constitution, Article XVI, Section 7 through 10)

A member is suspended when he is in arrears in his dues/ assessments for more than one year (XVI.7.H). Those who find themselves in this category lose all of the above rights and privileges.

Where a brother has a dues card from the previous year only

- i.e. one who has not paid the current year's dues/assessments, still retains many of the rights and privileges above except that of visitation.

Therefore, as Most Worshipful Grand Master, I do hereby issue the following EDICT:

Effective immediately, a brother who does not possess a current year's membership card (having one only from the previous year), and although not yet suspended, is not considered to be "in good standing" (Article XVI.IO.I). He, therefore loses the right of visitation. At that point, he may visit a Maryland Lodge only upon invitation of the Worshipful Master. This also applies to all Masonic bodies where a current dues card is required for admission.

This does not affect visitations to other Lodges where a member of that Lodge may object to a visitor (XYL 1 O.I)

It is my hope that more of our members are conscious of staying current with their dues and expect that there will be no future controversy on this issue.

## What was happening 50 and 100 years ago in Stephenson Lodge

## A REVIEW OF OUR ARCHIVED MINUTES

When I reviewed our archived minutes of 1963 for past Master Don Horton, I found many interesting facts recorded by our predecessors. The way they did business and handled degrees are somewhat different than today. Also, the meetings started and ended later than today's meetings. Here's a look at the summer of 1913 and 1963 to see what happened one hundred, and also fifty years ago in Lodge.



FRED C. JONES Worshipful Master 1913

June 18, 1913

A stated meeting of Stephenson Lodge No. 135 A.F.&A.M. was held in the Lodge room in the town of Darlington, Country of Harford, and State of Maryland on the 18th day of June A.L 5913-W.D. 1913.

The following Brethren were present. F.C. Jones, W.M.; J.P. Gibson, S.W.; L. Webster Selfe, J.W.; J.T. Jones, Secretary; R.O. Thomas, Treasurer; Charles A. Chandlee, Tyler; Joel Silver, S.D.; D. Gilpin Wilson, J.D; Stanley Spencer; and brother W. Smith.

The minutes of the last meeting was read and approved. The committee on Dr. I. W. Tobias' petition reported favorably-the first degree of Masonry was duly conferred upon him.

An invitation to the Lodge was received from Bro. J. P. Gibson inviting the members to attend Divine Services at the Episcopal Church on Sunday, June 29 to which was accepted and members were asked to meet at the Lodge room at 10:30AM on that date.

No further business appearing, the Lodge closed in harmony and good order until next stated meeting or during the Master's will and pleasure.

July 2, 1913

A stated meeting of Stephenson Lodge No. 135 A.F.&A.M. was held in the Lodge room in the town of Darlington, Harford Co., Md.

Present: F.C. Jones, W.M.; Rev. J.P. Gibson, S.W.; Lee Webster Selfe, J.W.; Harry Silver, S.D.; R. O. Thomas, J.D; Charles A. Chandlee, Tyler.

The Lodge was opened in the 3rd degree of Masonry for the dispatch of business. The 3rd degree was called off and the 1st degree opened. Brother I.W. Tobias, entered apprenticed was called and given the lecture of the first degree. Brother Tobias was then examined as to his proficiency. Entered Apprentice Lodge was closed and the craft resumed labor in the 3rd degree. A ballot on Brother Tobias application for the second degree being fair in the South, West, and East, was duly elected to received the second degreewhich was duly conferred.

No further business appearing, the Lodge closed in harmony and good order until next stated meeting or during the Master's will and pleasure.

July 16, 1913

A stated meeting of Stephenson Lodge No. 135 A.F.&A.M. was held in the Lodge room in the town of Darlington, Country of Harford, and State of Maryland on the 16th day of July A.L 5913-W.D. 1913.

The following Brethren were present. F.C. Jones, W.M.; J.P. Gibson, S.W.; L. Webster Selfe, J.W.; J.T. Jones, Secretary; R.O. Thomas, Treasurer; P.M. Spenser, Charles A. Chandlee, Tyler; Joel Silver, S.D.; D. Gilpin Wilson, J.D; Stanley Spencer; and brother W. Smith. [Included was a listing of various visitors]

The Lodge was opened for the dispatch of business in due form. The minutes of the preceding meeting was read and ap-

Brother I.W. Tobias, being in waitingwas examined in the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree of Masonry-and was duly elected to receive the third degree-which was conferred upon him. The Lodge was called off for August and September.

No further business appearing, the Lodge closed in harmony and good order until next stated meeting or during the Master's will and pleasure.

The committee having reported on the petition of Mr. Carl Allen Stearn and Mr. Neil Edward Adkins, ballot was spread and Mr. Carl Allen Stearn and Mr. Neil Edward Adkins was duly elected to receive the degrees of Masonry. The following communications were receivedfrom Aberdeen Lodge No. 187, Harmony Lodge, No. 52, Susquehanna Lodge No. 130 stating order of business and from Bro. W. Albert Caldwell a note of well wishes and from Bethel No. 55 I.O.J.D in regards to Installation of Officers to be held on Sat, June 15, 1963 at 8:00PM and notice of petition from Susquehanna Lodge No. 130 on Mr. Soren August Peterson, age 42, residence Have de Grace, Md. Bills were passed and ordered paid. There were no sick reported. The following Brethren volunteered for Perry Point Visitation: Bro. Deckman, Bro. Little, Bro. Bishop, and Bro Snyder. The W.M. reminded the Brethren of Church Services at Mt. Tabor Church on Sunday June 23, 1963 and also reported that Stephenson Lodge was represented at Grand Lodge Session held on May 21, 1963. The Master Mason Lodge was called off at 8:45PM and a F.C. Lodge was opened and PM Aaron Roland presented Bro. Donald Horton for examination in the catechism

of the F.C. degree. F.C. Lodge was closed at 9:00рм and labor resumed in the Master Mason degree and ballot was spread and Bro. Horton was duly elected to receive the Master Mason degree. Lodge was at ease at 9:10рм and labor resumed at 9:20рм and Bro. Horton was presented in the first section of the M. Mason Degree. This being Past Master Night the chairs were filled as follows: W.M. Gilbert Smith, S.W. Amos Little; J.W. Aaron Roland; Rex Biship-Secretary as J.D. Samuel Snyder as S.D; and as stewards-W. Deckman and Ellis Price. Lodge was at ease at 9:50PM and labor resumed at 10:00рм and Bro. Horton was presented in the Second and Third Sections of the Master Mason Degree. Brother Snyder delivered the charge. PM Emery Rasnake presented Bro. Horton with a lapel pin in behalf of his fellow workers. Bro. Smith that the W.M. for the privilege of conferring the degree. The WM recognized visitors from Harmony Lodge No. 53 and Aberdeen No. 187, Susquehanna, No. 130 and Mt. Ararat No. 44.

Poyner was read, giving permission to confer the E.A. degree on Mr. Ronald J. Maxwell on the same night he was elected. Master Mason Lodge was called off at 8:45 and an E.A Lodge was opened and Mr. Carl A. Stearn was presented in the first section of the E.A. degree. Lodge was at ease and labor resumed and Mr. Neil E. 
